





#### What is Star?

- Saving Tomorrow's Agricultural Resources (STAR) is a <u>program</u> designed to <u>help farmers and ranchers evaluate</u> and <u>improve</u> their conservation <u>practices.</u>
- STAR is a free, voluntary conservation assessment tool that allows
  producers to evaluate their nutrient and soil loss management practices on
  individual fields.
- The program <u>encourages the adoption of conservation practices</u> that meet the goals of the <u>Missouri Soil and Water Conservation Districts Association</u> as well as <u>local Soil and Water Conservation Districts</u>.
- By answering **a few simple** questions about crop rotation, tillage, nutrient applications, and conservation practices, **farmers receive a science-based rating of 1 to 5 STARs**, <u>indicating their commitment to sustainable practices</u>.
- The program <u>aims to empower farmers to choose conservation as the standard on</u> all agricultural lands, <u>ensuring a legacy of economic sustainability and healthy soils for future generations.</u>

## How does STAR get <u>STAR</u>TED?

- Promotion of the Program
  - News releases, radio spots, word of mouth, social media, etc.
  - To the SWCD
  - To the farmer
- Adoption of the Program
  - SWCD's First Responders
    - Board members are typically early adopters
    - Accept new ideas that help move conservation forward.
    - Have a higher interest in conserving and improving our Soil.
  - Farmer adoption using the free STAR Tool
- Program Assistance-recruitment
  - Navigators First Responder to the farmer EMT's if you will.
    - Critical have an important function
      - Helps the farmer to complete the evaluation form.
      - Helps guide the farmer to the necessary resources to accomplish goals.
      - There will be training.
        - Investment of staff time now for training
        - Can save staff time down the road

## How does STAR get STARTED? continued

- How many Navigators are we looking for
  - Dream Goal one per SWCD
  - Current Goal 30(one for each Field Office Service Area(FOSA)

#### Value of STAR participation

- Self evaluation and assessment of your farm management
  - Focusing on how to make your operation more sustainable
  - Focusing on your farm's health soil, economics and sustainability
  - Receive a science-based assessment-we have 17 members on our science and steering committee
- Navigational assistance
  - Guidance
    - To Technical assistance
    - To Financial assistance
    - To STAR's Resource Library
- Rewards
  - Pride in the knowledge that I care enough to look at my operation
  - Knowledge that there is a way to improve my situation
  - STAR signs let neighbors and others know that you are a recognized conservationist
  - Developing a Community of like-minded individuals

### Value of STAR participation, continued

#### Reports

- Completion of a CIP(Conservation Innovation Plan) could put you in a contest for a \$50 gift card
- Star Report Details
  - Identifies how you scored current management
  - Let's you know how you can improve to the next STAR level
- Landowner Report rental negotiations
- Lender Report Let your Banker know what you are doing for the land

#### Future Value

- <u>Potential</u> Incentives
  - i.e.: Siemer Milling Company offers incentives to their customers participating in STAR
  - USEPA ESA mitigation points ongoing talks now
