Jackson County SWCD Conservation Photo Contest

Feel Like You're Losing Ground?

If your soil is getting away from you, now is the time to contact your Soil & Water Conservation District office. The Jackson County Soil and Water Conservation District has the ability through cost-share dollars to help put conservation on your land. The cost-share program is an Ag based incentive program enabled through your tax dollars. The incentive program is funded through the Department of Natural Resources from the 1/10% sales tax shared between Parks/Rec and Soils.

Because all the cost share dollars for FY10 were not spent, the Soil and Water Districts Commission authorized the



implementation of a mid-year supplemental allocation of cost-share funds based on performance to put those FY10 funds into use. This allowed Jackson County SWCD \$35,000.00 more cost-share dollars to stop erosion in Jackson County.

While trying to get conservation on the land, the District Supervisors have made a new policy. The policy states the landowner that has a contractor ready to do the earthwork will be approved to receive funds. Many factors including time and weather doesn't always allow the conservation work to be applied.

Because the total allocated cost-share dollars exceeds their appropriation authority, the program office will monitor the obligations and once a threshold of \$20 million statewide is obligated, the system will shut down and no new contracts will be approved.

Protecting Urban Soil and Water Workshop

Jackson County Soil and Water Conservation District in conjunction with Jackson County Public Works is planning a Protecting Urban Soil and Water Workshop. The workshop will be Thursday, February 3, 2011 at the Ararat Temple, 5100 Ararat Dr., Kansas City, MO 64129-1998. The day begins with sign-in at 8:00 am with the workshop starting at 8:30 am. Participants have the opportunity to earn seven Personal Development Hours by attending the training. The cost of the workshop is \$50.00 which includes a buffet lunch.

Urban soil erosion and the accompanying problems of sedimentation and degradation of water quality are serious natural resource challenges in areas undergoing development. The dual detriment of losing valuable topsoil, then polluting streams, rivers, lakes, and infrastructure with it can be greatly reduced by using *best management practices*, low-impact development, and other strategies. Regulations under the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination system Phase II place special emphasis and enforcement on maintaining water quality by reducing urban erosion.
