Cost Share Programs Available to Assist with Rotational Grazing

<u>DSP-3, Planned Grazing Systems,</u> practice is available in participating counties through district cost-share. The main objective is to promote total resource management on pastureland through rotational grazing. Cost-share is available for interior fence, water and water distribution.

EQIP, Environmental Quality Incentives Program, is available through NRCS. The main objective of the program is to better manage present resources. Cost-share will be provided for components necessary to install a grazing system as well as addressing additional on the farm concerns.

MDC, Missouri Department of Conservation, provides cost share for alternative water and fence to exclude livestock from riparian areas.

<u>CCRP, Continuous Conservation Reserve</u>
<u>Program,</u> has cost share available for alternative water and fencing for riparian areas for livestock exclusion with enrollment of qualifying ground into CRP as marginal pasture.
