Maintaining water quality in our local streams and rivers, as well as the underground water table, is not an easy task; and sometimes there is just nothing

we can do. We do have a few conservation practices that are being utilized to address some of the concerns in our county.

- Well Decommissioning—protect our ground water from pollutants and provide safety for family and livestock
- Stream Protection—Riparian Forest Buffer, Streambank Stabilization, Stream Protection with alternative water and fencing
- Spring Development—capture the natural spring into a viable water source for livestock





These practices and services are funded through the 1/10th of 1% Parks, Soils and Water Sales Tax.

How Do My Cows Survive a Drought?

I don't have enough grass for my cows to eat. My ponds are all dried up and so are the creeks. What am I to do? Call the Gasconade County Soil & Water office at 573-437-3478 ext 3 for a free consultation to see if you qualify for technical/financial assistance.

Even if we are not having a drought, becoming a "grass farmer" through the Grazing System Management program is a sure way to have adequate grazing and clean water for your livestock. Once you have completed the required training through a certified Grazing School, we can assist you with technical and cost-share funding in establishing:

- A water source—well or pond structure
- Pipeline and watering facilities
- Cross fencing
- One time Lime and overseeding of legumes
