Maries County SWCD Now Owns The First Soil & Water District Building In The State

Under the reorganization of USDA in 1995, the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) that was housed in Maries County was required to move to the Osage County USDA office in Linn. While many of the districts in the closed offices moved with their partners to their new locations, the Maries County district board chose to remain in Vienna. In November of 2018, they can now boast that they are the first soil and water conservation district in Missouri to own its own building.

District Specialist Sandy Stratman said that when she first started working for the district, the office was located in what many know as the Chambers Building. Once NRCS made the decision to

move to Linn, she approached the district board to stay in the Vienna which would better serve the landowners of the county with the district's costshare program. However staying in the current location was not possible. After two moves to different sites

in Vienna, the district worked with Cellus and Evelyn Stratman to fund the building of the office at 105 Parkway in 2008. The district was able to work out a lease to own agreement and with additional payments made each year from rental fees earned by the district's no-till drills, the final payment was made.

Stratman said that many factors went into making it a reality. The district first had to gain permission from the Department of Natural Resources and the Soil & Water Districts Commission to start the project as funds for many of the district programs and administrative funds come directly from their portion of the Parks, Soils and Water Sales tax. She also wrote grants and many letters

asking for donations for the construction. She said that the building project and donations of labor and materials would not have been possible with the help of the following: The Maries County Bank, Louis & Julia Coover Foundation, Thomas R. Coffey Trust, Wal-Mart Distribution Center, Three Rivers' Helping Hands Foundation, Les Volmert, Maries County Commission, Cory Neier Construction, Stricklan Bobcat & Concrete, Ruben Wieberg Trenching & Backhoe, Lowe's of Jefferson City, Agri Drain Corporation and the Cellus and Evelyn Stratman Family.

A celebration will be held at the 2019 Annual Meeting in March.



District Poster & Essay Contest Theme is "Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper"

The Maries County Soil and Water Conservation District is once again conducting their annual poster and essay contests to acquaint students with the conservation of our natural resources. This year's theme for both contests is "Life in the Soil: Dig Deeper". Posters and essays should highlight that soil is a dirty topic, but everyone needs to learn more about it!

Soil is the foundation for many of the items we use in our daily life, such as food, clothing, clean water, homes and more. Healthy soil equals healthy food, which equals a healthy you. Don't treat your soil like dirt!

Any student living in Maries County and/or enrolled in the 3rd through 6th grades of any Maries County school or home-schooled in Maries County may participate in the Poster Contest. Posters should be on poster board measuring 14" x 22" and capable of supporting its weight when leaned against the wall. Only one individual may work on a poster. The name of the student, teacher, school, grade

poster. Students are not required to be in an art class to enter a poster. Poster board and the complete rules are available at the district office.

Each individual grade countywide will be judged together. From each grade, three posters will be chosen to win cash awards. Grade level prizes will be: 1st place - \$15, 2nd place - \$10 and 3rd place - \$5. From

> these winners one entry will be declared the grand prize county winner and receive an additional cash award of \$50. The first place poster from each grade will be sent to state competition. All grade winners will be notified and invited to the District's Annual Meeting


in March to receive their awards and to find out what prize they have one.

The district's **Essay Contest** is open to any student living in Maries County and/or enrolled in the 7th through 12 grades of any Maries County Junior or High School. Essays should be 400 to 500 words in length. It should be double spaced typed or legibly handwritten. Sources of information must be listed. A separate sheet of paper with the

student's name, address, grade, name of school and teacher's name should be stapled to the back of the essay. A student may also enter their essay directly to the district office. Only one essay per student is permitted.

The entries will be judged in three groups: 7th and 8th; 9th and 10th; and 11th and 12th. Awards will be given to the top three essays in each group. 1st prize will be \$50. 2nd prize will be \$25. 3rd prize will be \$15.

All contests will end on March 1, 2019. The posters and essays are due in the Soil and Water by the close of business on that date. The office is located at 105 Parkway in Vienna. If there are any questions, you may call the district office at (573) 422-3342.

Photos Now Being Accepted For Contest

It's that time of the year again to look back or take pictures for this year's Photo Contest. This is the fifteenth year for the event. Photographs must be taken in Maries County, Missouri and should be entered in the appropriate category and division.

The contest is divided into two Divisions: Youth (up to and including high school seniors) and Adult (any adult residing or owning land in Maries County). Each photo can only be judged in one of the following Categories: Trees/Plants/Landscapes; Wildlife; or Farming in Maries County.

Entries should follow these guidelines when entering:

- The contest is open to amateur photographers. Each participant may enter up to, but no more than five photographs. All photos must be taken in Maries County, Missouri. Photos will not be returned.
- Black-and-white prints and color prints are both acceptable. Photos cannot be accepted via email and must be no larger than 8x10 and they are not to be framed and/or matted.

◆ The following information must be attached to the back of each photo.
A. Photographer's name, address and phone number; B. Division (Youth or Adult) and Category (Trees/Plants/Landscapes, Wildlife or Farming in Maries County); C. Title of photograph; D. Subject Names (if people are in the photo); E. Location; F. Year photo was taken.

All Entries become the property of the Maries County SWCD, and Maries County SWCD reserves the non-exclusive right to use all photographs in publications, on the district's webpage, on display and/or for promotional purposes. Previous entries will not be judged for the 2019 contest.

Judges will select one county winner in each of the three categories in each division. Winning photos will be displayed at the Maries County SWCD 2019 Annual Meeting in March. Winners will receive \$25 and a framed print of their winning photo from the district. Honorable Mentions will receive certificates.

All entries must be postmarked or delivered to the office by March 1, 2019.
